Comparing the genome of 94 maltreated vs. 96 healthy non-traumatized children, three methylated genes were significant predictors of depression. [Methylation is a biochemical "epigenetic" change to DNA that may occur after maltreatment.] "Although epigenetic changes are frequently long lasting, they are not necessarily permanent." Interventions to reverse negative outcomes are briefly discussed and include "attachment-focused interventions, enrichment opportunities, and treatment to address both child and parent psychopathology".

Risk factors for recurrent injuries in victims of suspected non-accidental trauma: a retrospective cohort study.

Using a pediatric Medicaid database, of 1361 children with suspected non-accidental trauma (NAT), a similar event recurred in 27% within 1 year and 40% within 2 years. Risk factors for a recurrent NAT event included rural residence, age <30 months, and having a relatively minor initial injury such as a dislocation, open wound, or superficial injury.

From a database of 20 US academic center child abuse subspecialty teams, repeat consultations for suspected non-accidental trauma occurred in 3.5%. "Themes identified among the subset of patients suspected of repeated abuse included return to the same environment, failure to comply with a safety plan, and abuse in foster care."

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)-related posterior rib fractures in neonates and infants following recommended changes in CPR techniques.

Using databases from 3 German children's hospitals, "The results of this study suggest rib fracture after the use of the "two-thumbs" CPR technique is uncommon. Thus, there should be careful consideration of abuse when these fractures are identified, regardless of whether CPR was performed and what technique used. The discovery of rib fractures in an infant who has undergone CPR without underlying bone disease or major trauma warrants a full child protection investigation."

Use of psychotropic medication groups in people with severe mental illness and stressful childhood experiences.

Of 183 adults with severe mental illness, an association was found between increased history of childhood abuse and need for higher doses of antipsychotic medication and mood stabilizers.

In a review of 18 research articles including 2996 adults and youths with bipolar disorder, childhood sexual abuse was strongly associated with PTSD, and moderately strongly with suicide attempts, alcohol and/or drug abuse, early age of onset of bipolar disorder, and more psychotic symptoms.

Over a 16 year period, 290 patients with borderline personality disorder were more likely to experience pain and rate their pain as more severe than patients with other personality disorders. Predictors of pain severity included older age, depression, and severity of childhood abuse.

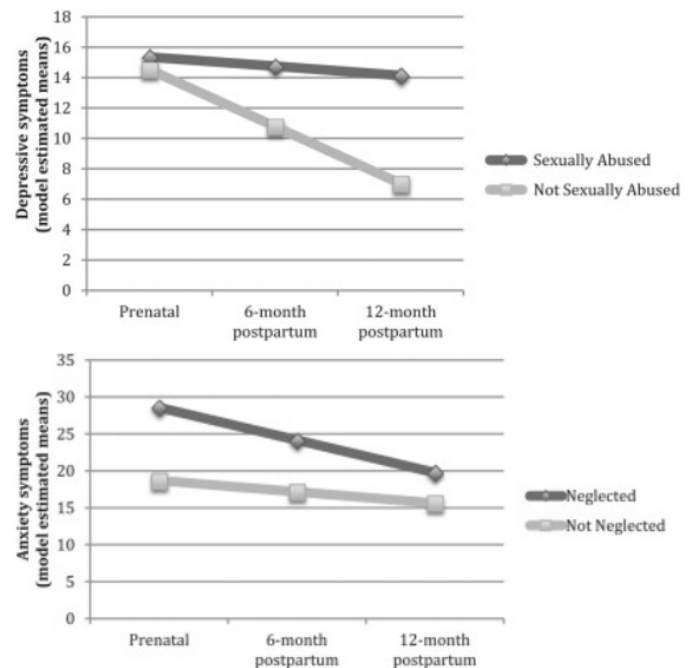

Of 50 women, those who were experiencing interpersonal stressors but not other stressors were found to have abnormal levels of ghrelin and leptin, two gut hormones associated with appetite regulation, leading to potential risk for weight gain and obesity.

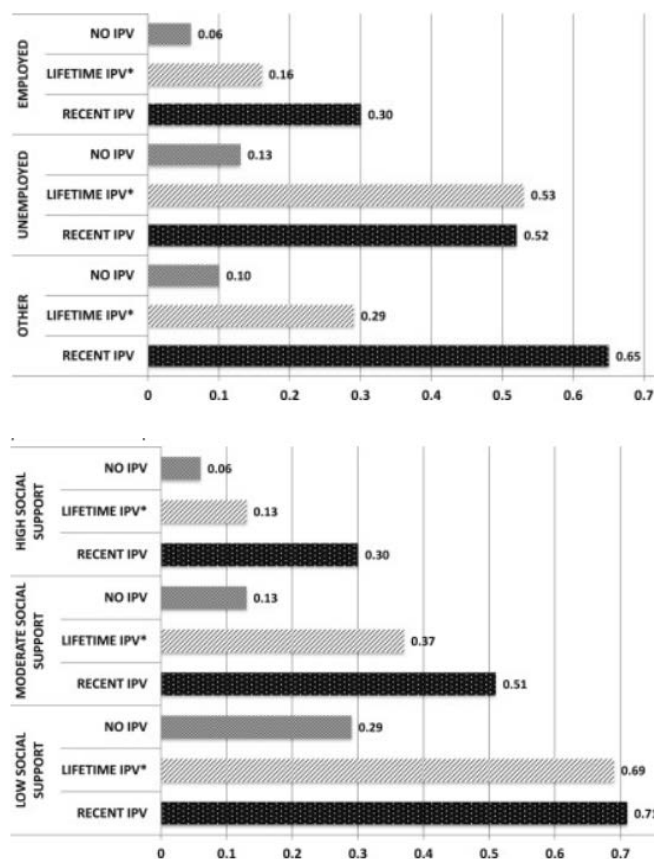

Of 45 ethnically diverse women in Florida aged 50+, 85% met with someone from online "seeking relationships". They reported experiencing adverse events from these interactions including financial exploitation (40%), threats (55%), and physical harm (38%).

Women were more likely to report to the police when they were assaulted by a stranger, or when they sustained a physical injury or an anogenital lesion.

[And alcohol use is associated with increased risk of college SV.]

A longitudinal study of risk factors for repeated sexual coercion and assault in U.S. College men.

Of 795 college men surveyed at the end of each of their 4 years in college, 30% reported at least one incident of sexual coercion and assault. Of this group, 68% engaged in repeated assault. Repeat offenders engaged in acts of higher severity that began at an earlier age, held more sexually aggressive beliefs, and manifested higher rates of antisocial traits.

Medical care following multiple perpetrator sexual assault: a retrospective review.

Int J STD AIDS. 2015 Feb;26(2):86-92. PMID: [24695016](#)

Multiple perpetrator sexual assault victims reported higher rates of stranger assaults, rape at more anatomical sites, and were more likely to sustain injuries than single perpetrator sexual assault. Only half of victims showed up for follow-up visit and only 1/3 completed HIV prophylaxis. Follow up was more likely if an anogenital injury was present.

Brenner I, Ben-Amitay G.

Sexual revictimization: the impact of attachment anxiety, accumulated trauma, and response to childhood sexual abuse disclosure.

For 60 Israeli women with a history of childhood sexual abuse, 70% reported adult sexual revictimization. Revictimization rates were significantly higher among women who had received negative response following initial abuse disclosure compared to a positive response and even compared to not disclosing.
